



**Live Out Loud Adventures
International Trip Leader Training Program

Part 1) Travel Medicine First Aid offered by Wilderness Medical Associates (WMA – www.wildmed.ca)

Dates – March 6th and 7th

Location – Southridge School, 2656 160 Street Surrey, BC

Duration - 22 hours over 2 days

Certification – Travel Medicine Certification issued by WMA



Developed in Canada but now being taught internationally, this program was created in conjunction with the Global Village program of Habitat for Humanity.

This course expands on Wilderness Medical Associates' wilderness first aid program, to include how to practically deal with medical issues that arise in a country that is not your own. This program expands on first-aid prevention and intervention by including topics such as:

- Disease pathways & prevention
- Country specific flora & fauna
- Evaluating medical clinic resources
- Travel medical insurance information
- Recommend inoculations
- Extreme environmental conditions
- Risk management for patient care & global evacuation

**Part 2) Risk Management for Staff & Faculty Leading International Trips

Duration - 15 hours over 2 days



This practical and hands on 2-day training will approach risk management from the staff and/or faculty leader perspective. We will present a framework for figuring out what you need to know and provide the map for finding out. We will also provide tools for preventing incidents from occurring and responding to them when they do and will practice working with these same tools.



Curriculum to Include:

- Navigating Risk for Leaders of International Excursions
- The Role of Staff/Faculty Leaders when leading International Excursions
- Tools of the Trade; hazard assessment and mitigation, site selection, student and service provider selection, contingency planning, ratios and supervision, record keeping, incident reporting, trip evaluation
- Managing Stakeholder Expectations of Trip Leaders
- Working with Service Providers
- Working with Students and Managing Behaviour
- Managing Risks associated with Billeting Students and Student Exchanges
- Resources for Leading Trips
- Responding to Emergencies in the Field

Program will include formal presentations, case studies, scenarios and much discussion.
